❄️ ❄️ ❄️ Winter Driving Tips ❄️ ❄️ ❄️

With winter fast approaching, our very own car expert, Conrad Rumjahn gave us some tips on how to make winter driving safer and less stressful... (thanks Conrad, I know I really needed these tips!)

Winter driving tips:

There are 5 areas that I'd like to mention. 1) the tires 2) the oil 3) the windshield wipers and washer fluids 4) the coolant and the 5) the battery and block heater

- 1) In snow, ice and slush, winter tires will make a big difference when you are stuck or slipping with spinning wheels. The tire material in most 4 season tires hardens when the temperature falls to -15°C , it loses its flexibility and frictional capability causing the vehicle to become harder to control. This control is also proportional to speed. (*slow down!*) Take a good look at your tires and your driving needs
- 2) The oil is classified by the Society of American engineers (SAE) and the American Petroleum Institute (API), in grade with specification for automotive application... to avoid all these complex technical terms, 5w30 is good for winter, 0w30 is good for extreme cold. 10w30 is recommended for spring to fall. 10w40 or 5w40 is good even in Las Vegas! There are a lot of vehicles using 5w40 year round, which is recommended by their manufacturer. *A Warning:* Synthetic and regular oil should not be mixed, and neither should the grade. One tip is to use brand name oil.
- 3) Special wiper blades are available for winter conditions and also special windshield washer fluid for summer and winter. The average fluids in most stores are -35°C , some are rated -45°C ... use your judgment. If the washer fluid is not up to par, your washer pump can be frozen and damage the pump when the weather gets colder.
- 4) The car engine uses liquids to help cool and maintain it at operating temperature by a thermostat. The system uses a water pump to circulate the liquids, it is here that we tap the heat to warm the cabin. The cold weather freezes the water at 0°C so we use anti-freeze (glycol mix with water) so that the coolant is still in fluid form even at -45°C . Ensure your car's anti freeze is up to strength. Damage to a frozen engine is expensive!
- 5) The battery is the life of the car. It is an electrical reservoir for the power needed to start your car. There is a system check by garages called an AVR test to verify that your car's battery, charging system and starting system is all in good health. It is also done in part to winterize your vehicle and to check your block heater and its cords.

That's it for now. If you have any questions you can drop a note with your phone number at the clubhouse and I will try to answer you as soon as time allows. Happy motoring!
