Dear members;

It is with mixed feelings that I am writing this January 2005 President Message. While I am wishing everybody a Happy New Year, I am also feeling the suffering and sadness of the losses caused by the South East Asian tsunami disaster. The magnitude 9.0 earthquake that occurred on December 26th, 2004 triggered one of the most tragic and deadliest tsunamis in history. Over hundred thousand lives were lost, destruction to properties and facilities were unimaginable – many homes and villages and cities were virtually wiped out. This disaster has altered the livelihood of tens of thousands of people worldwide - family members, relatives and friends were lost in matter of seconds, with countless number of orphans resulted from this disaster.

Amongst other countries, the tsunami waves struck Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, Sri Lanka, India, Myanmar, and as far away as Africa. With the rapidly increasing death tolls and deteriorating conditions in all these disaster stricken areas, it is important that we act quickly to help in the relief and rebuilding efforts presently being carried out by the many relief agencies from many countries of the world.

MSBCA-Calgary – has reacted to this disaster by donating to the Red Cross and is calling on all members to sup-

port the relief efforts by cash donations or join fundraising activities. Many of our members are already participating in fundraising activities such as fundraising dinners and events organized by the various Chinatown organizations. Believing that more funds can be raised by joint efforts from other organizations and groups, MSBCA-Calgary has joined the call from MLA Wayne Cao and has formed a fundraising team - the **Calgary Committee for Tsunami Relief** – to organize a fundraising dinner that is to be held on Friday, January 21, 2005, at the Telus Convention Centre in downtown Calgary. This fund raising dinner targets a total ticket sale of 1,000, priced at \$75.00 per ticket, with a large portion of the ticket cost eligible for charity tax deductibles. Program of the fundraising dinner includes cultural performance from several cultural groups and a silent auction. You can support and participate in this event by purchasing the tickets to this dinner and donating items for the silent auction. Values of the donated items are also eligible for charity tax deductible. Please contact myself for your ticket reservation and May Lee for the donation of items for the silent auction.

Your donations, whether it being cash or items for silent auction, or participation in fund raising dinners and events, will go a long way in the relief and rebuilding efforts. While I am still on this subject, I like to thank Harry and Becky Win for their generous offer to print the upcoming tsunami relief fundraising dinner poster at their cost, May

Lee for her active participation in this fund raising event, and everyone who volunteers to help in this event.

During the December Board members meeting, the first draft of the partially revised MSBCA-Calgary Bylaws was presented to the Board for comments. Ken and Kim are continuing with the review with comments received from the Board members. A door bell unit, with built-in camera and video-audio monitor has been purchased and will be installed very soon. This enhances the security and safety by preventing unexpected guests or intruders during the use of the clubhouse. A key-containing unit, with numbered combination lock, has also been purchased. This will improve accessibility to the clubhouse for our members, especially the volunteers who need to have frequent access for preparation works etc. Once this is installed, all you need to do is call one of the Board members for the combination number, which will be changed frequently, to gain access to the keys.

While the Board members are working together to improve operation of the association and the clubhouse, we would also like to hear from our members. Please forward your comments and suggestions to any of the Board members so that we can continue to improve.

We lucky Canadians shouldn't forget that the tsunami wasn't the only major natural disaster to hit the world last year. Crude oil topped \$50 US for the first time in 20 years, then dropped again, leaving many of us wondering just how long it'll be before our Calgary gas pump prices hit \$1.

Whew that's all I can think of. One door closed, one opening. Happy New Year everyone, I wish you all the best in the coming year.

All other person names listed have already indicated they would like to volunteer for casino.

Some of the rules have changed slightly in particular only people in positions for General Manager, Alternate GM, Banker & Count Room Supervisor need to sign form. But everyone must bring in their photo ID. Some pointers & rules for volunteers:

1. No alcohol and gambling (including slot machines) before/during/after your shift for the entire 2 day event.
2. Volunteer assigned to a position at the beginning of the casino CANNOT change to another position during the 2 day event.
3. All volunteers MUST have a photo identification with them at all times during the casino event.
4. All volunteers must sign in before their shift.
5. No outside food or beverages are to be brought into the casino unless person has special dietary restrictions.
6. Budget \$300 per day for concession.

Volunteers covering 10:30 am - 7:30 pm shift are entitled to 2 meals. 10% tips automatically added on to the final bill.

7. Please arrive on time for your shift.
8. Please notify myself at 880-8885 at least 2 weeks prior if you need to cancel.
9. Please park anywhere. General Manager & Banker have their own designated stalls.
10. Hospitality Suite is equipped with TV, VCR, fridge, microwave and complimentary coffee.
11. No smoking in Hospitality Suite, Cash Cage & Count Room.

12. Casino operates from 12:00 noon - 2:00 am but Count Room typically leave later to reconcile the money.
13. If desired a security guard can escort any volunteer to their car at the end of their shift.
14. Training & support will be provided by the Casino staff people for all the above positions. We will have 2 paid employees during our 2 day event. I.e. the Cash Cage Advisor and Count Room Advisor.

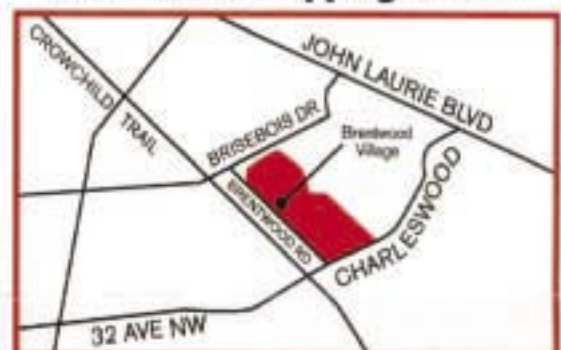
